SUBJECT: LICENSE RENEWAL – **CORRECTED COPY** AND RESPONSE TO DISPUTED VIOLATION (LICENSE RENEWAL AND NOTICE OF VIOLATION ISSUED DECEMBER 20, 2013)

Dear Mr. Chance:

This is in response to your letter dated January 19, 2014 (ML14027A331), which replied to the Notice of Violation issued on December 20, 2013 (ML13364A364). The violation, which involved the failure to obtain the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) approval and consent in writing prior to the merger associated with the radioactive materials license, was identified during the renewal of your license.

In a letter dated May 19, 2014 (ML14157A038), you asserted that technically your facility did not have a name change and one should not have been requested during the renewal. Furthermore, you stated that although a merger at the corporate level took place, the facility name remained Frontier Refining LLC and no change of ownership or control of materials occurred. In addition, you state that Item 1 of your license is in error and request that it be reverted back to the previous legal entity, Frontier Refining LLC who is the lowest level of incorporation and owns and controls the radioactive material authorized by License Number 49-26892-01.

Subsequently, the NRC acknowledges your disputed violation and is issuing a **corrected copy** to Amendment Number 11 to License Number 49-26892-01 **correcting Item 1 to the license to change the name back to Frontier Refining LLC from the current name of Holly Frontier.**

NRC will periodically inspect your radiation safety program. Failure to conduct your program according to NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC may result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation; imposition of a civil penalty; or an order suspending, modifying, or revoking your license as specified in the NRC Enforcement Policy.
