Dear Mr. Landers:

While reviewing your request stated in letter dated May 13, 2014, it came to our attention that errors occurred in the corrected copy of Amendment No. 13 to your NRC Materials License No. 24-18952-01, issued on January 5, 2011. Therefore, we are issuing a second corrected copy of Amendment No. 13. These errors involved our failing to update certain Subitem Nos. and License Conditions in accordance with current licensing policy. We regret these errors and apologize for any inconvenience they may have caused you.

In particular, please note that we have modified Subitem Nos. 7.A. through 7.D., and 8.A. through 8.D., and Condition Nos. 12, 13.A., 13.B., 13.D., and 17.B. Note also that we have renumbered the Conditions subsequent to Condition No. 12, and have modified the order of certain License Conditions.

The corrected copy of Amendment No. 13 should also have added markings to the license document to identify that it contains security-related sensitive information, as described below. Note that the major changes made to your license are printed in **bold font**.

In accordance with your email message dated and received on July 23, 2014, we acknowledge your withdrawal of the amendment request for a new Radiation Safety Officer (RSO) until such time as additional training and experience (i.e., for non-routine maintenance) for this individual can be completed. If you wish to pursue this matter, please prepare a written response, currently dated and signed by you or another senior management official that includes documentation of training and experience for the proposed new RSO in conducting non-routine maintenance. Please address your response to my attention at the above address and reference it as "additional information to control number 583927" to facilitate proper handling in our office so that we may then continue our review. We also request that with that response, you submit a copy of a delegation of authority memorandum for the proposed RSO that is signed by a senior management official and the proposed RSO, stating that this individual accepts the position as RSO, and understands the duties and responsibilities associated with this position. Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. Pursuant to NRC's RIS 2005-31 and in accordance with Title 10 *Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) 2.390, the enclosed license document is exempt from public disclosure because its disclosure to unauthorized individuals could present a security vulnerability.
