REQUEST FOR LICENSE AMENDMENT (LAR 14-03) FOR THE VIRGIL C.
SUMMER NUCLEAR STATION UNITS 2 AND 3: TIER 2* EDITORIAL AND
CONSISTENCY CHANGES (TAC NO. RQ0420)

Dear Mr. Jones:

By letter dated June 12, 2014 (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. ML14164A098) and supplemented by letter dated July 9, 2014 (ADAMS Accession No. ML14190B342), South Carolina Electric & Gas Company (SCE&G) submitted a request for a license amendment (LAR) for the Virgil C. Summer Nuclear Station, Units 2 and 3. The proposed license amendment request would depart from the plant-specific Design Control Document (DCD) Tier 2* material contained within the Updated Final Safety Analysis Report by making editorial and consistency corrections.

The purpose of this letter is to provide the results of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff's acceptance review of this LAR. The acceptance review was performed to determine if there is sufficient technical information in scope and depth to allow the NRC staff to complete its detailed technical reviews. The acceptance review is also intended to identify whether the application has any readily apparent information insufficiencies in its characterization of the regulatory requirements or the licensing basis of the plant.

Consistent with Section 50.90 of Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR), an amendment to the license must fully describe the changes requested, and follow as far as applicable, the form prescribed for original applications. Section 52.79 of the 10 CFR addresses content of technical information required. This section stipulates that the submittal address the design and operating characteristics, unusual or novel design features, and principal safety considerations.

The NRC staff has reviewed your application and concluded that it does provide technical information in sufficient detail to enable the NRC staff to complete its detailed technical review and make an independent assessment regarding the acceptability, of the proposed amendment in terms of regulatory requirements and the protection of public health and safety and the environment.
