Dear Mr. Porter:

This letter acknowledges receipt of your letter dated May 29, 2013 (received on June 2, 2014), requesting an amendment for an alternate schedule for decommissioning of the Scotia Depot in Scotia, New York, and serves to inform you that we have conducted our acceptance review of your request and have determined that the information provided is sufficient to begin the technical review. Please note that the acceptance review does not reflect the technical adequacy of the information provided and we may request additional information as a result of the technical review. We will issue a Federal Register Notice, in accordance with NUREG-1757, Consolidated Decommissioning Guidance: Decommissioning Process for Materials Licensees, Vol. 1, Rev. 2, dated September 2006, stating that we are commencing the technical review.
