Dear Dr. Arsenault:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 22 to your NRC Material License No. 21-16656-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the major changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

**Please note that, at this time, we were unable to approve because the information in your letter dated, was insufficient to complete our review.**

**Please submit a written response within 30 days of the date of this letter, that is currently dated and signed by a senior management representative (in accordance with 10 CFR 35.12(a)), addressed to my attention at the above address as “additional information to control number 585819.”**

**Note that this is a different control number than the one we referred you to use previously in our letter dated January 6, 2015. Upon receipt of your response we will then continue our review.**

**In our letter to you dated January 6, 2015, we advised you that Condition No. 11 includes two Radiation Safety Officers (RSOs): you, for all authorizations except brachytherapy, and Talgit Sandhu, Ph.D. for brachytherapy.**

**At this time we must delete one of the RSO's listed on this license because 10 CFR 35.24(b) permits only one RSO on a medical use license under 10 CFR Part 35.**

**We received your written response dated January 19, 2015, directing us to delete Talgit Sandhu, Ph.D. as the RSO for brachytherapy, in favor of retaining you as the RSO for the entire licensed program.**

**However, the information we requested to demonstrate that you have had the training to comply with the requirements in 10 CFR 35.50, especially 35.50(e) as it pertains to the brachytherapy program, was not included.**

**We will need that information in order to proceed with our review of this matter.**

**In addition, please submit a revised, currently dated and signed "Delegation of Authority," such as the example in Appendix I, NUREG 1556, Vol. 9, Rev. 2, "Consolidated Guidance About Materials Licenses: Program - Specific Guidance About Medical Use Licenses." This document can be found on our website at:**

**Section 8.11 Item 7, Appendix B and Appendix D in the NUREG 1556, Vol. 9, Rev. 2 above, should also prove useful in preparing your response to demonstrate compliance with 10 CFR 35.50(e).**

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter and its enclosure will be available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the NRC's Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS), accessible from the NRC Web site at <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html>.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you.

This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions.

Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
