Dear Mr. Hsueh:

Under cover letter of June 20, 2013, you have asked for our concurrence regarding a report that was conducted to identify traditional cultural properties within the project area. You have confirmed that the area has been subject to an intensive Class III field inventory for archeology, history, and architectural resources. We cite a number of other surveys completed in this defined "Area of Potential Effect" (APE). Our previous comments and/or review of these surveys were made variously over a number of years. According to our records these include:

The scope of the project has apparently not changed. In our opinion, the findings of the Environmental Assessment (1988) and a subsequent Environmental Assessment (1998) have addressed our comments under the standpoint of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, as amended and 36 CFR Part 800. Our previous reviews for archeology,

history, and architectural resources remain unchanged, with the findings of “no effect” by the undertaking.

As you indicated, the report (undated and author not cited) has been done to address Tribal interests and you have initiated consultation with the Crow and Santee Sioux Nations. Consultation with Tribes is done on a government-to-government basis. To that end, we can make no representations whatsoever for, or on behalf of, or in regard to the participation of Tribes in this process and/or in regard to their identification of cultural resources.
