SUBJECT: NRC CONSENT TO DIRECT LICENSE TRANSFER AND AMENDMENT NO. 30

Dear Mr. Andrews:

By letter dated March 9, 2015 (received at the U.S. NRC Region III office on April 14, 2015), Farmington Missouri Hospital Company, LLC d/b/a Mineral Area Regional Medical Center submitted to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Region III Office a Request for Consent to direct License Transfer of NRC Materials License No. 24-18040-01. Based on the information provided, we understand that as a result of a proposed purchase of assets by Parkland Health Center from Farmington Missouri Hospital Company, LLC d/b/a Mineral Area Regional Medical Center, control of Farmington Missouri Hospital Company, LLC d/b/a Mineral Area Regional Medical Center would be directly transferred to Parkland Health Center. We further understand that this transfer will not result in any change to the licensed materials, persons using the license material, location of use of licensed material, or persons responsible for the licensee's radiation safety program. Based on information provided by Mark L. Beanblossom, Licensed Medical Physicist, Associated in Medical Physicists, LLC, we understand that, on May 1, 2015, all of Farmington Missouri Hospital's assets and operations were directly transferred to Parkland Health Center. We have updated the license accordingly.

Enclosed is Amendment No. 30 to your NRC Material License No. 24-18040-01 in accordance with letter dated June 25, 2015, confirming that the transaction has been completed as described in the March 9, 2015 letter. Changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

Please also note that we have reviewed a letter dated June 1, 2015, signed by an individual with the title of "Assistant Administrator" and determined that the letter contains insufficient information to terminate the license at this time. To request to terminate the above referenced license, please submit an NRC Form 314, "Certificate of Disposition of Materials," which may be found at the NRC website, <http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/doc-collections/forms/nrc314.pdf>. The form must be signed and dated by a duly authorized management official, and include contact information including the name and the address of the individual to which the final license termination amendment should be transmitted. If final radiation survey results are not included with the submitted NRC Form 314 – due to transfer of operations to another NRC licensee – the NRC licensee assuming oversight must submit a license amendment request, adding all existing Parkland Health Weber Road locations of use to its own NRC license.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

Based on the above understandings and as more fully detailed in the enclosed NRC staff's Safety Evaluation Report which documents the NRC staff's review of the request, we have no objection to the proposed transfer.
