Mr. Hoe,

I was informed that you may be interested in the licensing actions related to Source Materials License No. SUC-1593 for possession only of depleted uranium from the Davy Crockett Weapon System. This license was issued in October 2013. The authorized places of use shall be United States Department of Army Installations at Schofield Barracks HI, and Pohakuloa Training Area, HI.

The U.S. Army Installation Management Command (the Army) submitted its application, dated June 1, 2015, (Agencywide Documents Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. ML15161A454) to amend Source Materials License No. SUC-1593 to address the 15 sites subject to License Condition No. 12 (ML13259A062). The Army proposes to use a Programmatic Approach to licensing these additional sites, and has included in its application the two Hawaiian Sites that are already licensed under this license. A copy of the NRC's letter (ML15167A502), dated June 17, 2015, acknowledges receipt of this application and identifies the NRC's process for determining if the application can be accepted for a detailed technical review. The NRC's acknowledgement letter and the Army's application are now publicly available. The current license remains in effect and will not be changed unless the NRC approves the proposed changes, and amends the license.
