Sattar,

In August 2011 we exchanged emails regarding the subject matter. Your August 22, 2011 email to me contained the following statement, "Please note that NRC regulations do not permit storage of licensed material indefinitely and require the licensees to dispose of the stored material as soon as practical."

Subsequent to that email I have disposed of ALL UNUSED Nuclear Gauges and "Stand-Alone" Sources. A reduction of approximately 90% of our inventory.

*Our current inventory now consists of just two (2) Troxler 3440 Gauges.*

Our NRC Materials License (No. 45-23090-01) expires July 31, 2015. *What affect does our reduced inventory have on the license renewal process and associated NRC Annual Fees?*
