Dear Mr. McCarty:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 19 to your NRC Material License No. 21-13687-01 in accordance with your request, with the exception of listing new Assistant Radiation Safety Officers (ARSOs) on the face of the license. As noted in my July 10, 2015 email message and discussed via phone on July 22, 2015, the NRC generally limits the listing ARSOs in cases where the licensee provides an explicit reason for the named ARSO (i.e. oversight for a specific location of use or radioactive materials use application, etc.).

Changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font. Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture. We strongly encourage you to review this material and adapt it to your particular needs in order to develop and maintain a positive safety culture as you engage in NRC-regulated activities.
