Please confirm receipt of this communication.

This is in reference to your letter dated June 8, 2015 requesting to amend Nuclear Regulatory Commission License No. 55-25547-01. Since your license was placed in "Stand-by" in December 2014, the rationale for why you are requesting to be placed back into medical use status needs to be submitted to support your request. Please provide a letter signed by management stating that you have identified a guaranteed supplier of radiopharmaceuticals to support your operations going forward, along with any other information that supports your request.

If we do not receive a reply from you within 30 calendar days from the date of this letter, we will assume that you do not wish to pursue your application and remind you that you will need to terminate the license if you do not return to operations by the expiration date (August 31, 2015).
