Dear Mr. Beanblossom:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 24 to your NRC Material License No. 24-16616-01 in accordance with your request, with the exception of amending this license to add locations of use currently authorized on a separate NRC license. Changes made to your license are printed in **bold font**.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

To add the new Weber Road location of use, please submit a signed and dated cover letter requesting to add the specific address. Attach a facility diagram for all added areas of use. The attached facility diagram should be drawn to scale, indicate what that scale is, show use areas and any room numbers, and describe what is adjacent to the radioactive materials use area(s). Please also indicate whether any PET radionuclides are being used at the facility. If PET is being used, additional calculations may be required to demonstrate that shielding is adequate. The request must be submitted simultaneously with the submission of a request to remove the locations of use from the license under which those locations are currently authorized.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.


