SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF PUBLIC MEETING CONDUCTED FOR THE  
DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT FOR THE  
TURKEY POINT, UNITS 6 AND 7, COMBINED LICENSE APPLICATION

On April 22, and 23, 2015, members of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff held public meetings at the Florida International University-Stadium Club, in Miami, Florida, and the Hampton Inn and Suites Miami South/Homestead in Homestead, Florida concerning the staff's environmental review of the combined license (COL) application submitted by the Florida Power and Light (FPL). The purpose of the meetings was to present the preliminary findings of NUREG-2176, "Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Combined Licenses (COLs) for Turkey Point Nuclear Plant Units 6 and 7 – Draft Report for Comment," and provide the public with an opportunity to comment on the draft EIS which was issued in February 2015.

Formal presentations were made by the NRC staff and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), - Jacksonville District. The NRC's presentation provided an overview of the draft EIS's conclusions and the NRC's preliminary recommendation, which is that the COLs be issued. This preliminary recommendation is based on: (1) the application, including the Environmental Report (ER) submitted by FPL; (2) consultation with Federal, State, Tribal and local agencies; (3) the staff's consideration of comments received during the public scoping process; and (4) the assessments summarized in this EIS including the potential mitigation measures identified. The USACE presentation provided an overview of the Department of the Army application permitting process pursuant to Section 303 of the Clean Water Act, Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbor Act of 1899, and Section 14 of the Rivers and Harbors Act. Also, information on the proposed project's USACE Public Notice was discussed.

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In an effort to improve communication and increase interaction with members of the public, the NRC staff conducted an open house one hour before each meeting. During the open house, the staff provided displays and brochures and met with members of the public to answer questions about the proposed COL application for Turkey Point Units 6 and 7.

After the formal presentations were given, members of the public were invited to provide comments. Approximately 350 people total attended all the meetings. Attendees included members of Federal, State and local governments, FPL and the nuclear industry, representatives from public interest groups, and members of the general public. Comments received were in both support and opposition of the COL application.
