SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR WITHHOLDING INFORMATION FROM PUBLIC DISCLOSURE –
TRANSMITTAL OF "WCAP-17938 ACCEPTANCE REVIEW GAPS" JULY 18,
2015, MEETING PRESENTATIONS

Dear Mr. Russ:

By letter dated July 10, 2015 (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession Number ML15197A168), Westinghouse Electric Company, LLC (Westinghouse) submitted an affidavit dated July 10, 2015. In the affidavit, Westinghouse requested that the information contained in the following document be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR), Part 2, Section 2.390:

AW-15-4228, Submittal of "Technical Exchange Meeting Related to WCAP-17938
Acceptance Review Gaps" Presentations for the Meeting held on June 18, 2015

A nonproprietary copy of this document has been placed in the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC) Public Document Room and added to the NRC ADAMS Library under Accession Number ML15197A169.

The affidavit stated that the submitted information should be considered exempt from mandatory public disclosure for the following reasons:

- a. The information reveals the distinguishing aspects of a process (or component, structure, tool, method, etc.) where prevention of its use by any of Westinghouse's competitors without license from Westinghouse constitutes a competitive economic advantage over other companies.
- b. Its use by a competitor would reduce his expenditure of resources or improve his competitive position in the design, manufacture, shipment, installation, assurance of quality, or licensing a similar product.

We have reviewed your application and the material in accordance with the requirements of 10 CFR 2.390, and on the basis of the statements in the affidavit, have determined that the submitted information sought to be withheld contains proprietary commercial information and should be withheld from public disclosure.

Therefore, the version of the submitted information marked as proprietary will be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 2.390(b)(5) and Section 103(b) of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended.

Withholding from public inspection shall not affect the right, if any, of persons properly and directly concerned to inspect the documents. If the need arises, we may send copies of this information to our consultants working in this area. We will, of course, ensure that the consultants have signed the appropriate agreements for handling proprietary information.

If the basis for withholding this information from public inspection should change in the future such that the information could then be made available for public inspection, you should promptly notify the NRC. You also should understand that the NRC may have cause to review this determination in the future, for example, if the scope of a Freedom of Information Act request includes your information. In all review situations, if the NRC makes a determination adverse to the above, you will be notified in advance of any public disclosure.
