One of our primary concerns, from the beginning of this effort, has been to ensure that places of significance to the tribes within our license area that may be affected by project activities be identified so that we can, to the extent possible, protect them from disturbance. In an effort to support NRC, we are planning to open the Crow Butte license renewal area, the Three Crow Expansion Area, the Marsland Expansion Area and the portion of the North Trend Expansion Area where access is available to visitation during November 2012.

Specifically Cameco proposes:

- Pre-arranged visitation will be available anytime from Thursday November 1st through Friday November 16, 2012 during daylight hours.
- Cameco will provide \$125 per day per diem, mileage at 55¢ per mile for one mobilization to and from tribal headquarters and for daily round-trips from Chadron to the site and back
- Cameco will provide an unconditional grant of \$5,000 to each tribe choosing to participate in the site visit.
- Each visitor will be provided a safety briefing and will be asked to sign a release of liability in Cameco's favor.
- If more than three days are lost due to rain or snow, an additional five days will become available during the last week of November, with payment of per diem and mileage for another mobilization.

Cameco representatives will escort tribal representatives to the sites and will remain in the vicinity, but will not directly accompany the tribes during their efforts. Cameco would appreciate NRC attendance throughout the effort. Cameco encourages the tribes to combine efforts if possible to facilitate scheduling and access.

Cameco requests that tribes communicate the results to NRC either verbally or in written form no later than January 15, 2013 to the NRC. If the tribes determine that additional field effort is required, Cameco will consider proposals that include a detailed scope, budget and schedule.
