Dear Mr. Goorevich:

Enclosed is an application, dated June 24, 2015, received by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission from Transport Logistics International, requesting amendment No. 01 to its existing license, XSOU8839. The license presently authorizes the export of 260,000 kilograms (kg) uranium as natural uranium hexafluoride (UF_6) to Europe for uranium enrichment at URENCO plants in Germany, The Netherlands, and the United Kingdom to ultimately be used as fuel in nuclear power facilities in the EURATOM community.

The purpose of the amendment is to increase the quantity of uranium to be exported from 260,000 kg to 1,500,000 kg. Assurances from EURATOM that the material will be subject to all of the terms and conditions of an agreement for cooperation, are required. Your assistance in obtaining the necessary assurances will be appreciated.

Please note that the material is of Australian, Canadian, Kazakhstani, Namibian, Russian, U.S., Uzbekistani, Nigerian, Malawian, and EURATOM origin. Thus it has Australian, Canadian, and EURATOM obligations.
