Dear Ms. Kroeber,

On April 21, 2015, Randolph Ragland and John Nicholson of this office conducted a security inspection at the above address of activities authorized by your NRC license. The inspection continued in-office until September 04, 2015. The inspection was an examination of your licensed activities as they relate to radiation safety and to compliance with the Commission's regulations and the license conditions. The inspection consisted of observations by the inspector, interviews with personnel, and a selective examination of representative records. Additional information received by the NRC on August 19, 2015, was also examined as part of the inspection. The findings of the inspection were discussed by telephone with Joseph Vaccarelli, Erik Lyons, Katherine Steiner, and Craig Stegmaier on September 04, 2015.

Based on the results of this inspection, the NRC determined that one violation of NRC requirements occurred. Because of the security-related nature of this violation, specific details of this violation will not be provided in this letter, but instead are provided in non-public enclosures. The violation was evaluated in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy. The current Enforcement Policy is included on the NRC's website at <http://www.nrc.gov/about-nrc/regulatory/enforcement/enforce-pol.html>. The violation is cited in the Notice of Violation (Notice), provided as Enclosure 1 to this letter. The violation is cited because the violation was identified by NRC. Enclosure 2 provides a description of the corrective actions taken by The Hospital of Central Connecticut to address the violation.

The NRC has concluded that information regarding the reason for the violation, the corrective actions taken and planned to correct the violation and prevent recurrence is already adequately addressed in our records. Therefore, you are not required to respond to this letter unless the description of your corrective actions in Enclosure 2 does not accurately reflect your corrective actions or your position. In that case, or if you choose to provide additional information, you should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice.
