I'm responding to the request for comment on the plant-specific draft supplement to the Generic Environmental Impact Statement for License Renewal of Nuclear Plants, regarding the renewal of operating licenses for the operation of the Oconee Nuclear Station (ONS).

Relicenses, with no new construction or land disturbance, should have no effect on any properties included in or eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places. We have had the opportunity to meet with the ONS's consultant and discuss identified National Register properties and identified cultural resources in the ONS area. The ONS should be aware that there might be unidentified archaeological sites within the plant area. Any future construction or land management activities could affect archaeological sites. ONS may want to address the issue of future identification and management of cultural resources in the plant area as part of its continued operation.
