By letter dated August 22, 1985, Duke Power Company (Duke) submitted a proposed revision to the Oconee Nuclear Station Technical Specifications. One revision addressed in the submittal concerned Specification 6.1.2.1.

In support of the NRC Staff's review, a conference call was held with members of my staff regarding the proposed revisions to Specifications 6.1.2.1(a, c, and e). Specifically, the Staff requested information concerning the qualifications of the Station Services Superintendent and the Integrated Scheduling Superintendent. Attachment 1 provided the minimum qualifications required for the Superintendent of Station Services and the Superintendent of Integrated Scheduling.

As indicated earlier, the August 22, 1985 letter submitted a proposed revision to Specification 6.1.2.1, specifically parts (a), (c), and (e) of the specification. The initial proposed revision to these three parts need to be updated. To this end, please find attached (Attachment 2), which provided an updated version of the revisions to specification 6.1.2.1.

Briefly, this update would permit the Station Services Superintendent to approve procedures and procedure changes for fire protection and security related procedures only (see specification 6.1.2.1(a)). The Station Services Superintendent has been deleted from specification 6.1.2.1(c) and (e).

For clarity purposes, Attachment 2 provides the updated revision of pages 6.1-2 and 6.1-3. These two pages submitted by this letter, supersede in its entirety the revisions to pages 6.1-2 and 6.1-3 submitted by my August 22, 1985 letter.

Superintendent of Station Services

The Superintendent of Station Services shall have a minimum of seven (7) years of responsible nuclear or fossil station experience, or applicable industry experience, of which a minimum of one (1) year shall be nuclear station experience. A maximum of two (2) years of the remaining six (6) years of experience may be fulfilled by satisfactory completion of academic or related technical training on a one-for-one time basis. The Superintendent of Station Services should also have a familiarity with nuclear station security and fire protection techniques used at Duke Nuclear Stations, management skills and an understanding of the Duke administrative policies and procedures.

Superintendent of Integrated Scheduling

The Superintendent of Integrated Scheduling shall have a minimum of seven (7) years of responsible nuclear or fossil station experience, or applicable industrial experience, of which a minimum of one (1) year shall be nuclear station experience. A maximum of two (2) years of the remaining six (6) years of experience may be fulfilled by satisfactory completion of academic or related technical training on a one-for-one, time basis. The Superintendent of Integrated Scheduling should also have a familiarity with the scheduling and project management techniques used at the Duke Nuclear Stations, management skills, and an understanding of the Duke administrative policies and procedures.
