Gentlemen:

By letter dated January 21, 1986, Duke Power Company (Duke) submitted a proposed license amendment for the Oconee Nuclear Station (ONS) Facility Operating Licenses and Technical Specifications. The changes were to revise the technical specification concerning the chemical treatment ponds by deleting Technical Specification 3.9.4c. Based on a February 11, 1987 conference call between Duke and NRC Staff members, a revision to the original submittal is being provided as a supplement to the amendment request.

Pursuant to 10 CFR 50.90, please find attached a supplemental proposed amendment to the ONS Facility Operating License and revisions to the ONS Technical Specifications (Attachment I). Attachment II contains additional technical justification.

Regarding the issue of no significant hazards consideration, an analysis of the proposed amendment, submitted as Attachment 2 with our letter dated January 21, 1986, was performed in accordance with the standards contained in §50.92. This analysis remains valid with the following comment. The maximum allowable rate of radionuclide inventory buildup in the pond as proposed in the amendment request is equivalent to that permitted in the current specification. It changes only the manner in which we assure compliance with the previously established limits. This amendment does not involve a significant hazards consideration.

Since this submittal consists of a supplement to a previously submitted amendment request, Duke considers no additional license fees are required. By copy of this letter, Duke has forwarded this supplemental application to the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control.
