Enclosure 2, "Administration of Written Examinations," describes your responsibilities for conducting written examinations. Enclosure 3, "Procedures for the Administration of Written Examinations," describes applicant responsibilities during the administration of the written examination. Please ensure that all applicants are aware of these rules.

Your review of the written examination will be conducted in accordance with the procedures specified in Enclosure 4, "Facility Review of Written Examinations."

Signed operator license applications in accordance with 10 CFR 55 Subpart D, "Applications", certifying that all applicants have successfully completed the facility licensee's requirements to be licensed as an operator or senior operator and that all applicants meet the medical requirements, must be submitted at least 14 days before the start date of the examinations. This will allow the chief examiner time to review and process the applications. If this review cannot be completed in time to decide an applicant's eligibility, that applicant will not be permitted to sit for the examination. Therefore, it is recommended that license applications be timely provided to ensure an appropriate level of review.

The NRC has posted copies of the application forms, "Personal Qualification Statement— Licensee" (NRC Form 398) and "Certification of Medical History by

Facility Licensee” (NRC Form 396) on the agency’s Web site at www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/doccollections/forms/nrc398.pdf and www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/doc-collections/forms/nrc396.pdf. These forms are in Adobe Acrobat® format.

This letter contains information collections requirements that are subject to the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995 (44 U.S.C. 3501 et seq.). These information collections were approved by the Office of Management and Budget, approval numbers 3150-0018 and 3150-0024.

The burden to the public for these mandatory information collections is estimated to average
