Dear Licensing Board,

We are livestock operators that have 360 acres about two miles from Cameco's Crow Butte operation.

We have a shallow domestic well we use for household, livestock, and drinking water. The property also has running surface water from springs, that are used daily by our livestock.

I have visited the mine and have studied to a small extent the process used to extract the uranium.

In my research I can see very little risk from the uranium or the chemicals used to extract it.

We see no adverse effects on our selves or our livestock.

To my knowledge the medical community at Crawford or Chadron has not identified any adverse effects from the mine.


We think the process and the onsite daily monitoring by the regulatory agencies is very good.
