

SECTION C - Description/Specifications

C.1 STATEMENT OF WORK

EVENT: "2016 APPLICATION OF SAFEGUARDS TO GEOLOGICAL REPOSITORIES MEETING"

DATE OF EVENT: April 25-28, 2016

TIME: 8:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.

BACKGROUND: The International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) organized an international group of experts in 2005 to address safeguards challenges in the development of nuclear waste repositories. This group, which is called the Application of Safeguards to Geological Repositories (ASTOR), is comprised of nine member States and the IAEA. Together these States meet annually to address scientific and technical issues associated with repository development, as well as related societal, political, legal and economic implications.

OBJECTIVE: The principle aim of the work of ASTOR focuses on practical aspects of the generic integrated safeguards approach for geological repository sites and the safeguards techniques applicable to specific geological repository sites. The 2016 annual meeting will focus on the completion of the 10 year ASTOR report (via "breakout sessions"), and include technical plenary sessions, including lessons learned from the Yucca Mountain Directorate.

ATTENDEES: NRC representatives, IAEA representatives, US Department of Energy (federal attendees and laboratory attendees), foreign nationals from various countries, to include but not limited to: Belgium; Canada; Czech Republic; Finland; France; Germany; Hungary; Sweden (all by invitation only)

FACILITY LOCATION: The NRC requires the services of a hotel conference center within walking distance (no greater than 0.5 miles) to a red-line metro stop anywhere from Shady Grove metro station in Gaithersburg, MD to Chinatown metro station in Washington, DC.

TECHNICAL AND OTHER SPECIAL QUALIFICATION REQUIRED: Four total rooms shall be required for April, 25-27, 2016 and one main conference room for April 28, 2016 as follows:

- 1 main/large conference room (to accommodate approximately 60 attendees with a conference room or classroom set-up). In addition, 2 extra tables shall be provided in the main conference room for light refreshments/coffee/etc.
- All rooms shall be pre-arranged and include tables and chairs.
- 3 smaller breakout rooms (on April 25-27) accommodating 20 seats around tables, arranged in a u-shaped set-up for focused discussion topics.

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- An Audi-Visual technician shall be available for 1 hr. each morning prior to start of conference for set-up and troubleshooting. The AV technician will also be available for an additional hour each day to provide assistance if technical difficulties arise.

Other Notes for Consideration:

- Venue equipment must be utilized
- Laptops will be supplied by conference attendees
- Projectors will be needed for each room procured
- All rooms (main and breakouts) should be available until approx. 7:00PM (and potentially beyond) to facilitate longer working group discussions
- Each traveler who needs overnight lodging will be required to contact the hotel to make their own reservations for government-rate rooms

(b) Performance of the work under this contract is subject to the technical direction of the NRC contracting officer's representative. The term technical direction is defined to include the following:

(1) Technical direction to the contractor which shifts work emphasis between areas of work or tasks, authorizes travel which was unanticipated in the Schedule (i.e., travel not contemplated in the Statement of Work or changes to specific travel identified in the Statement of Work), fills in details, or otherwise serves to accomplish the contractual statement of work.

(2) Provide advice and guidance to the contractor in the preparation of drawings, specifications, or technical portions of the work description.

(3) Review and, where required by the contract, approve technical reports, drawings, specifications, and technical information to be delivered by the contractor to the Government under the contract.

(c) Technical direction must be within the general statement of work stated in the contract. The contracting officer's representative does not have the authority to and may not issue any technical direction which:

(1) Constitutes an assignment of work outside the general scope of the contract.

(2) Constitutes a change as defined in the "Changes" clause of this contract.

(3) In any way causes an increase or decrease in the total estimated contract cost, the fixed fee, if any, or the time required for contract performance.

(4) Changes any of the expressed terms, conditions, or specifications of the contract.

(5) Terminates the contract, settles any claim or dispute arising under the contract, or issues any unilateral directive whatever.

(d) All technical directions must be issued in writing by the contracting officer's representative or must be confirmed by the contracting officer's representative in writing within ten (10) working days after verbal issuance. A copy of the written direction must be furnished to the contracting officer. A copy of NRC Form 445, Request for Approval of Official Foreign Travel, which has received final approval from the NRC must be furnished to the contracting officer.

(e) The contractor shall proceed promptly with the performance of technical directions duly issued by the contracting officer's representative in the manner prescribed by this clause and within the contracting officer's representative authority under the provisions of this clause.

(f) If, in the opinion of the contractor, any instruction or direction issued by the contracting officer's representative is within one of the categories defined in paragraph (c) of this section, the contractor may not proceed but shall notify the contracting officer in writing within five (5) working days after the receipt of any instruction or direction and shall request that contracting officer to modify the contract accordingly. Upon receiving the notification from the contractor, the contracting officer shall issue an appropriate contract modification or advise the contractor in writing that, in the contracting officer's opinion, the technical direction is within the scope of this article and does not constitute a change under the "Changes" clause.

(g) Any unauthorized commitment or direction issued by the contracting officer's representative may result in an unnecessary delay in the contractor's performance and may even result in the contractor expending funds for unallowable costs under the contract.

(h) A failure of the parties to agree upon the nature of the instruction or direction or upon the contract action to be taken with respect to the instruction or direction is subject to 52.233-1 - Disputes.

(i) In addition to providing technical direction as defined in paragraph (b) of the section, the contracting officer's representative shall:

(1) Monitor the contractor's technical progress, including surveillance and assessment of performance, and recommend to the contracting officer changes in requirements.

I.2 52.232-39 UNENFORCEABILITY OF UNAUTHORIZED OBLIGATIONS. (JUN 2013)

(a) Except as stated in paragraph (b) of this clause, when any supply or service acquired under this contract is subject to any End User License Agreement (EULA), Terms of Service (TOS), or similar legal instrument or agreement, that includes any clause requiring the Government to indemnify the Contractor or any person or entity for damages, costs, fees, or any other loss or liability that would create an Anti-Deficiency Act violation (31 U.S.C. 1341), the following shall govern:

If the EULA, TOS, or similar legal instrument or agreement is invoked through an "I agree" click box or other comparable mechanism (e.g., "click-wrap" or "browse-wrap" agreements), execution does not bind the Government or any Government authorized end user to such clause.
- (3) Any such clause is deemed to be stricken from the EULA, TOS, or similar legal instrument or agreement.

f. Invoice/Voucher. The appropriate sequential number of the invoice/voucher, beginning with 001 should be designated. Contractors may also include an individual internal accounting number, if desired, in addition to the 3-digit sequential number.

g. Date of Invoice/Voucher. Insert the date the invoice/voucher is prepared.

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h. Billing Period. Insert the beginning and ending dates (day, month, year) of the period during which deliverables were completed and for which payment is requested.

i. Description of Deliverables. Provide a brief description of supplies or services, quantity, unit price, and total price.

j. Work Completed. Provide a general summary description of the services performed or products submitted for the invoice period and specify the section or Contract Line Item Number (CLIN) or SubCLIN, in the contract pertaining to the specified contract deliverable(s).

k. Shipping. Insert weight and zone of shipment, if shipped by parcel post.

l. Charges for freight or express shipments. Attach prepaid bill if shipped by freight or express.

m. Instructions. Include instructions to consignee to notify the Contracting Officer of receipt of shipment.

n. For Indefinite Delivery contracts, the final invoice/voucher shall be marked FINAL INVOICE" or "FINAL VOUCHER".

o. Total Amount Billed. Insert columns for total amounts for the current and cumulative periods.

p. Adjustments. Insert columns for any adjustments, including outstanding suspensions for deficient or defective products or nonconforming services, for the current and cumulative periods.

q. Grand Totals.
