SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR WITHHOLDING PROPRIETARY INFORMATION FROM PUBLIC DISCLOSURE FOR VIRGIL C. SUMMER NUCLEAR STATION UNITS 2 AND 3, "RESPONSE TO REQUEST FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION LETTER No. 5 (eRAI 7801) RELATED TO FUKUSHIMA NEAR-TERM TASK FORCE RECOMMENDATION 4.2, "MITIGATION STRATEGIES FOR BEYOND DESIGN BASIS EXTERNAL EVENTS," ENCLOSURE 1.

Dear Ms. Rice and Mr. Gresham:

By letter dated March 31, 2016 (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. ML16091A481), South Carolina Electric & Gas Company (SCE&G/licensee) submitted an affidavit (in Enclosure 5) dated March 31, 2016, signed by Ms. April Rice that requested the information contained in Enclosure 3, "Proprietary Version of VCSNS Units 2 and 3 Operational Program Implementation Schedule in Accordance With License Conditions 2.D.(11) and 2.D.(12)(e)," be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR), Part 2, Section 2.390.

A nonproprietary (redacted) version of the document may be found in Enclosure 1 to the March 31, 2016 submittal. The document may be found in the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC) Public Document Room and has been added to the NRC Library in ADAMS.

The affidavit stated that the submitted information should be considered exempt from mandatory public disclosure for the following reasons:

1. The information has been held in confidence by Westinghouse.
2. The information is of a type customarily held in confidence by Westinghouse and not customarily disclosed to the public; a rational basis exists for making this determination. The information should be held in confidence for the following reasons (itemized in Enclosure 1):
 - (a) The information reveals the distinguishing aspects of a process (or component, structure, tool, method, etc.) where prevention of its use by any of Westinghouse's competitors without license from Westinghouse constitutes a competitive economic advantage over other companies.
 - (c) Its use by a competitor would reduce his expenditure of resources or improve his competitive position in the design, manufacture, shipment, installation, assurance of quality, or licensing a similar product.

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3. The information was transmitted to and received by the Commission in confidence.
4. The information is not available in public sources.
5. Public disclosure of the information is likely to cause substantial harm to the competitive position of the owner of the information.

We have reviewed your application and the material in accordance with the requirements of 10 CFR 2.390, and on the basis of the statements in the affidavit, have determined that the submitted information sought to be withheld contains proprietary commercial information and should be withheld from public disclosure. Therefore, the version(s) of the submitted information marked as proprietary will be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 2.390(b)(5) and Section 103(b) of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended.

Withholding from public inspection shall not affect the right, if any, of persons properly and directly concerned to inspect the documents. If the need arises, we may send copies of this information to our consultants working in this area. We will, of course, ensure that the consultants have signed the appropriate agreements for handling proprietary information.

If the basis for withholding this information from public inspection should change in the future such that the information could then be made available for public inspection, you should promptly notify the NRC. You also should understand that the NRC may have cause to review this determination in the future, for example, if the scope of a Freedom of Information Act request includes your information. In all review situations, if the NRC makes a determination adverse to the above, you will be notified in advance of any public disclosure.
