Dear Dr. O'Toole:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 70 renewing your NRC Material License No. 24-02704-01 in accordance with your request dated November 12, 2015. In addition, the amendment addresses your March 2, 2016 letter in which you confirmed that all residual licensed material has been removed from the 930 Carondelet Drive location of use, such that any remaining residual radioactivity is within the limits of 10 CFR Part 20, Subpart E, and is ALARA. Please also note that we have added NRC's Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) document accession numbers to the documents referenced in Condition 14.

Based on its review, the staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material has been removed from your facilities located at 930 Carondelet Drive, Suite 200, Kansas City, Missouri, and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities does not exceed current NRC criteria. Based on these conclusions no further remediation or actions with respect to NRC regulated material is required for your facilities located at 930 Carondelet Drive, Suite 200, Kansas City, Missouri. Your facilities at that location are suitable for unrestricted use.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we may provide appropriate corrections and answers.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
