JOINT STATUS REPORT

By order dated October 21, 1999, the Presiding Officer (1) decided to defer further action in the proceeding in order to allow the U.S. Department of the Army (Army) time to pursue, at its option, amendments to the Army's current materials license "to remove terms and conditions that [are] not necessary to preserve the public health and safety with respect to usage of the [Automatic Chemical Agent Detector Alarm (ACADA)]" and (2) ordered the Army and the Staff to report periodically to the Presiding Officer on any progress made regarding this approach. Prehearing Conference Order, dated October 21, 1999 (Order) (unpublished), at 5-6. Counsel for the Army has authorized Staff counsel to submit the following report on behalf of the parties.

As indicated in the attached letter, the Army has informed the NRC that it intends to submit applications to amend the licenses and permits held by four branches of the Armed Services with respect to possession and use of the ACADA. Letter from Colonel Steve Reeves, Army, to John Hickey, NRC, dated October 21, 1999. Such amendments, which


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will be available in draft form by the end of November, 1999, will address removal of certain leak testing and accountability requirements.

Headquarters and regional NRC staff that would be responsible for handling any ACADA-related requests for license amendments or requests for exemptions from the regulations have been alerted and are coordinating their efforts.

Dear Mr. Hickey:

This letter is a follow-up from the pre-hearing meeting held on October 13, 1999 at the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC) Headquarters for Docket Number 030-34610. As a result of the cooperative discussions held among both parties (Army and NRC) and the Administrative Law Judges, this letter is to notify you of the Army's intent to submit a request to amend the existing licenses/permits of the four Armed Services authorizing possession and use of the M22 Automatic Chemical Agent Alarm. As per instructions from Judge Charles Bechhoefer, amendments will be submitted pursuant to 10 CFR § 30.11 (Specific Exemptions), § 30.38 and other applicable authorities.

The license amendments will address, among other things: a) removal of radiation monitoring wipes after the Department of Defense (DoD) has taken delivery from the original manufacturer, i.e., Graseby Dynamics, Limited, and (b) accountability of assets only through the military property accounting system(s). It is desired that once the draft of the amendment is made available, a coordination meeting will be held with DoD representatives, NRC HQ staff, and appropriate NRC regional staff members to review the draft prior to submittal. The draft amendments are anticipated to be available within approximately 30 days. Based upon Judge Bechhoefer's requirement for both parties to provide status updates every 30 days, we are hopeful that all reviews will be conducted on an expedited basis.

I will provide to you, via separate letter, my comments related to the Chemical Agent Monitor surfaced by the NRC.


