

**Quarterly Status Report for Technical Assistance  
Provided by the United States Department of Energy  
July 1 – September 30, 2013  
4<sup>th</sup> Quarter of Fiscal Year 2013**

**I. Introduction**

The Department of Energy (DOE) and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) have entered into five interagency agreements for DOE to provide technical assistance in carrying out NRC's responsibilities with respect to classified matter protection programs at various licensee sites. These interagency agreements are:

- *J5713 – Classification of Information at the Louisiana Energy Services Uranium Enrichment Facility;*

Each of the interagency agreements contain terms that require DOE to provide quarterly reports describing DOE activities relating to each of the agreements.

This is the fourth report prepared in accordance with the terms of the agreements.

**II. Description of Activities During this Reporting Period**

The DOE continued development and delivered a specialized training class to train NRC derivative classifiers in the use of CG-LCP-4A, *Joint NRC/DOE Classification and Official Use Only Guide for Louisiana Energy Services Gas Centrifuge Plant*.

The DOE provided technical support to the NRC during the annual NRC information security inspection at the URENCO U.S.A. (UUSA) facility in Eunice, NM, in August 2013.

A summary of the activities associated with each facility follows.

**C. Classification of Information at the Louisiana Energy Services Uranium Enrichment Facility – J5713**

During this reporting period, technical support provided by DOE included the following:

- Prepare travel authorization and make travel arrangements;
- Travel to the UUSA facility in Eunice, NM, to participate in the annual NRC information security inspection;
- Review a random sampling of classified documents generated on site;

- Review a random sampling of unclassified documents generated on site;
- Review a random sampling of classified documents that were sent to the site from sites in Europe;
- Review a random sampling of unclassified documents that were sent to the site from sites in Europe;
- Review a random sampling of documents sent via the point-to-point (p2p) network; and
- Review the security plan developed by UUSA for International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) visits; and
- Prepare inspection report.
