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U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission Public Meeting Summary

May 25, 2016

Title: Staff Action on Near-term Task Force Recommendation 11.3

Date of Meeting: Wednesday, May 25, 2016

Location: NRC Headquarters, 3WFN 9A32

Type of Meeting: Category 2

Purpose of the Meeting:

To present the findings of staff action conducted in accordance with Near-Term Task Force (NTTF) Recommendation 11.3, which tasked the staff with studying the efficacy of real-time radiation monitoring onsite and within the EPZs including consideration of AC independence and real-time availability on the Internet.

General Details:

The NRC conducted a Category 2 public meeting; where members of NSIR staff presented and discussed preliminary findings associated with the study conducted of real-time radiation monitoring on-site and within the 10 mile emergency planning zone (EPZ) in accordance with NTTF Recommendation 11.3. The meeting was scheduled from 10:30am to 12:00am at NRC headquarters in Rockville, Maryland, in the 3WFN 9A32 conference room. Meeting participants consisted of: five NRC staff members, including four NSIR staff and one NRR/JLD staff member, six industry stakeholders, and one member of the general public. At 10:30am the meeting was initiated by Robert Kahler, Branch Chief of the NSIR/DPR Inspection and Regulatory Improvements Branch (IRIB). Mr. Kahler provided opening remarks, and discussed the purpose of the meeting before introducing Steve Lavie, Senior EP Specialist, NSIR/DPR/IRIB, to make the staff's presentation. A brief summary of the presentation is provided below. Following the presentation, the floor was opened for stakeholder and public engagement on the topic. There was one comment from a non-affiliated member of the public regarding the accessibility of the NRC public website. With no additional questions or comments being proffered, the meeting was adjourned at approximately 11:10am.

Summary of Presentations:

Steve LaVie, Senior EP Specialist, provided a 30 minute presentation on the process and results of staff action related to NTTF Recommendation 11.3. Mr. LaVie's presentation focused on the process, specific considerations, and the regulatory and technical analysis conducted during the study. A general summary of the findings presented by Mr. Lavie are as follows:

current emergency plans adequately address radiological monitoring and assessment, protective active recommendations are based on plant conditions and not off-site dose

measurements, fixed station environmental monitors would not provide a substantial increase to the protection of public health and safety, and the availability of real-time data to the public could negatively impact the ability of public officials to implement protective action recommendations.
