SUBJECT: INIMICALITY REVIEW FOR THE TURKEY POINT  
NUCLEAR STATION, UNITS 6 AND 7 COMBINED  
LICENSE APPLICATION

To grant an application for a combined license, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) must find, as required by Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* 52.97(a)(1), that issuance of the license is not inimical to the public health and safety or the common defense and security. This finding is based on compliance with NRC regulations and an assessment of facts known to the NRC that might present inimicality concerns. This memorandum documents the conclusion from the Office of Nuclear Security and Incident Response (NSIR) staff's inimicality review concerning the subject combined license application.

A combined license application for Turkey Point Nuclear Station, Units 6 and 7 has been filed by Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) and was most recently updated on August 26, 2016 (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System Accession No. ML16251A127).

As documented in the staff's safety evaluation report, the applicant demonstrated compliance with the NRC's safety and security regulations. Also, the NRC staff is not aware of any information presenting inimicality concerns or foreign ownership, control or domination concerns that would require additional assessment for inimicality purposes. NextEra Energy, Inc. (which previously operated as FPL Group, Inc.) has two principal operating subsidiaries: FPL and NextEra Energy Resources. FPL is an investor-owned electric utility. NextEra Energy Resources is NextEra Energy, Inc.'s competitive energy subsidiary which produces the majority of its electricity from clean and renewable fuels. FPL's common stock is held solely by NextEra Energy, Inc. (which previously operated as FPL Group, Inc.). The combined operating license (COL) application includes the names and addresses of the directors and officers of FPL and indicates that all are United States citizens. According to the COL application, FPL is not owned, controlled, or dominated by any alien, foreign corporation, or foreign government. The NRC staff does not know or have reason to believe there is a foreign ownership, control, or domination issue with FPL.
