SUBJECT: NRC REVIEW OF APPLICATION FOR XCOM1274

Dear Mr. Woodward:

I am writing to update you on the status of your export license application (XCOM1274), currently under review by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), for the export of two AP1000 reactor coolant pump heat exchangers to China. As per Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* 110.40(d), if the Commission has not completed action on a license application within 60 days after receipt of the Executive Branch judgement, the NRC is required to inform the applicant in writing of the reason for the delay.

The NRC received the Executive Branch judgement on your license application on August 3, 2016. Due to the 60-day review ending on October 2, 2016, we are informing you that the reason for the delay was attributed to the time needed for NRC to complete verifying the correct unit number noted for the Haiyang Nuclear Power Plant.
