SUBJECT: NRC CONSENT TO DIRECT LICENSE TRANSFER AND AMENDMENT NO. 61

Dear Mr. Adams:

By letter dated August 16, 2016 (ML16235A176), Floyd Memorial Hospital (Floyd) and Baptist Healthcare System, Inc. (Baptist) submitted to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) a Request for Consent to direct License Transfer of NRC Materials License No. 13-12371-01. Based on the information provided by Mark Truman, Vice President, Floyd and David Gray, Vice President, Baptist, we understand that as a result of a full asset purchase, control of the licensed operation from Floyd would be directly transferred to Baptist. We further understand that this transfer will not result in any change to the licensed materials, location of use of licensed material, or persons responsible for the licensee's radiation safety program. Based on information provided in that letter and by you, in a subsequent October 5, 2016 letter (ML16280A384), we understand that, on October 1, 2016, all of Floyd's assets and operations were directly transferred to Baptist, and resulted in a name change. We have updated the license accordingly.

Enclosed is Amendment No. 61 to your NRC Material License No. 13-12371-01 in accordance with your letters dated August 16 and October 5, 2016, notifying our office of the pending transaction, and confirming that the transaction has been completed as described in those letters. Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we may provide appropriate corrections and answers.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture. 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You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

Based on the above understandings and as more fully detailed in the enclosed NRC staff's Safety Evaluation Report which documents the NRC staff's review of the request, we have no objection to the proposed transfer.
