- 1.0 The procedures stated herein are designed to control the use of the radiation producing devices under license to ENI US Operating Company at locations within the State of Alaska.
- 1.1 Direct responsibility for the overall radiation safety program in regards to radiation safety and in regards to fixed gauge use is assigned to Geoff Ackerman, who is designated as Radiation Safety Officer for all safety aspects pertaining to fixed gauges. The other Safety Specialists are designated as onsite Radiation Safety Supervisors.
- 1.1.1 Initial training for the safe operation and required periodic maintenance will be performed by the RSO or a Qualified Person designated by Eni. This training will be given to the Authorized Users of the unit.
- 1.1.1.1 A 4 hour annual refresher will be conducted for all authorized users covering the safe use of radiation, case histories and amendments and revisions to the radiation safety program.
- 1.1.2 Authorized Users shall have the authority to use and supervise the use of the sealed sources authorized by the company license.
- 1.1.3 A copy of these instructions will be made available to each Authorized User
- 1.1.4 Personnel working around or in the vicinity of a sealed source authorized by the company license will be instructed in basic hazards of radiation and instructed where the device is located and instructed to stay clear of this area. Training will be commensurate with the individual's job responsibilities in the vicinity of and/or with the gauge.
- 1.1.5 Each Authorized User will sign a statement as to the fact that they have read and understand these instructions by means of an examination prior to performing and working with radiation producing equipment.
- 1.1.6 Radiation Safety Regulations of the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) have been used as guidelines in the preparation of these instructions. The objectives of these instructions are to protect the health of the general public and employees of the firm, and to prevent disabling accidents. It is the responsibility of every concerned employee to have a working knowledge of these instructions.
- 1.1.7 The Nuclear Regulatory Commission has the authority to modify, suspend, or revoke any radioactive material license which they issue or to take any actions necessary to ensure careful handling of radiation producing equipment in their jurisdiction. These instructions must be followed explicitly as set forth by Federal and State authorities. If any doubt exists concerning these instructions or the safe use of a fixed gauge, the Radiation Safety Officer shall be contacted immediately.

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- 1.1.8 Violations of the conditions and procedures set forth in these instructions, by an employee, shall be just cause for punitive action.
- 1.2 Radioactive sources and the fixed gauge equipment will be housed and controlled at the following facility:

 Nikaitchuq- Oliktok Point Pad
 Oliktok Point, Alaska
 - 1.2.1 The total effective dose equivalent to individual members of the public will not exceed 0.1 rem in a year.
- 1.3 All records required under the NRC regulations for review and inspection will be kept in the office of the Radiation Safety Supervisor, in the Operations Health, Safety, Environmental Department at Nikaitchuq Operations Center (NOC).

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
