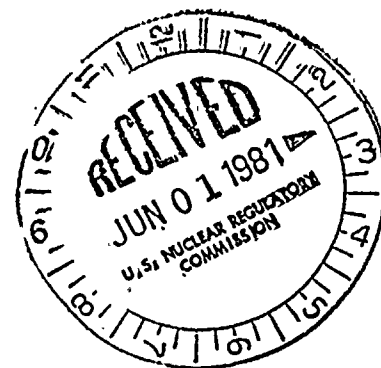

In accordance with the guidelines established for the reporting of 10CFR50.55(e) conditions, your staff was informed on March 9, 1981, of a "Potentially Reportable" condition regarding Contract 215's Temporary Installation Program. When this condition was initially identified by Corrective Action Request No. 1453, the contractor's Temporary Installation Program was in complete disarray. The contractor has since accounted for all items which were on hold by receiving and for which temporary installations were authorized. Temporary installation of material (e.g. hangers) for which no receiving inspection holds were appropriate, will be removed or verified acceptable during system walkdown and re-verification.

The contractor has now elected to use the Inspection Report (IR) which has more visibility, to document and control temporary installation.

Our evaluation of this condition has determined that it is not reportable under the provisions of 10CFR50.55(e).
