The Supply System reviewed the requested amendment per 10 CFR 50.92 and determined that it does not:

- 1) involve a significant increase in the probability or consequences of an accident previously evaluated because the administrative controls serve the same function as the mechanical interlock; namely, to ensure containment integrity is maintained; or
- 2) create the possibility of a new or different kind of accident from any accident previously evaluated because the interlock mechanism design has not been altered, and as stated in the reference, there is ample precedent for administrative controls being utilized; or
