I have reviewed the documentation that the BLM submitted to me on 1/30/79 regarding the above referenced project, and I have the following comments:

- 1) Regarding the significance of the 5 archaeological sites identified as potentially being effected by this project (AZ T:11:3, 6 & 16(MNA); AZ T:12:2(MNA); and AZ T:13:4(MNA)), one of the sites, AZ T:11:6(MNA) - Cashion Archaeological Site, was entered in the National Register of Historic Places on December 19, 1978. I have previously given my opinion to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (8/9/77) that site AZ T:11:3(MNA) is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. And from the documentation submitted, it appears that at least two, and possibly all three, of the remaining sites also may meet the criteria of eligibility for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places. The research proposed at these sites should provide the basis for a more definitive evaluation of their significance.
- 2) Regarding effect, I agree with the BLM's determination that implementation of the Museum of Northern Arizona's Research Plan for data recovery (prepared by Don Weaver, dated 12/1/78) should allow for a "no adverse effect" determination to be made pursuant to the Advisory Council's Guidelines for Making "Adverse Effect" and "No Adverse Effect" Determinations for Archaeological Resources in Accordance with 36 C.F.R. Part 800.)
