Dear Mr. Lindholm:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 2 to your NRC Material License No. 24-35065-01 in accordance with your request.

In your correspondence to us dated October 26, 2017, you indicated that you wished to release for unrestricted use a former address of use located at 500 Big Bear Boulevard, Columbia, MO 65202. Based on the information provided, the staff has concluded that all licensable material has been removed from this facility, and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities does not exceed current NRC criteria. Based on these conclusions, no further remediation or actions with respect to NRC regulated material is required for this address of use and this location is suitable for unrestricted use.

Additionally, please note that License Conditions 19.A. and 19.B., as described on License Amendment No. 1, have been removed from your license as these conditions are not applicable to the types of portable gauges your organization is authorized to possess.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
