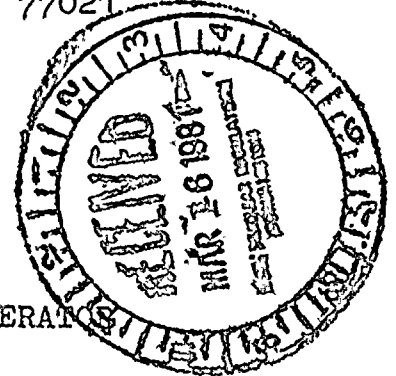

The DEIS on Page 5-6, appears to indicate placing the steam generator on site for disposal is an acceptable procedure. However, would this not be squandering usable storage which might be needed if subsequent steam generators to be repaired are too degraded in condition to be removed from the site?

The possibility of over-degradation of a steam generator has been noted with regard to the Surry, Virginia Unit II, steam generator repair in NUREG/CR-1454, Vol. 1, on Page 75. If Florida Power and Light Company is going to repair all steam generators, shouldn't the preference be to hold open storage on site in view of this?
