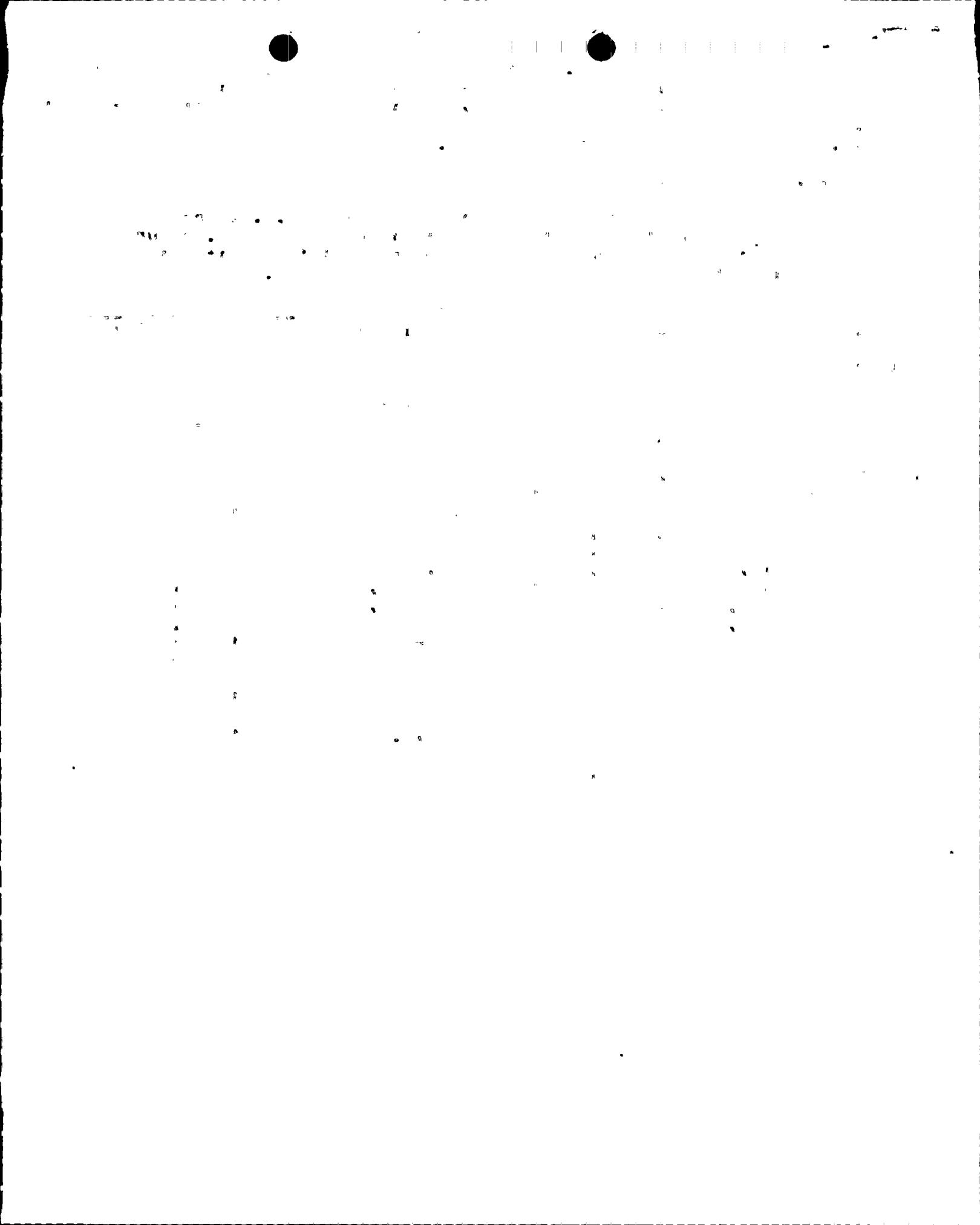
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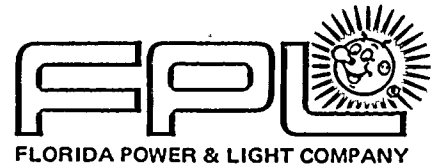

Item II. K. 3.5 of NUREG 0737 required an evaluation of the necessity of an automatic Reactor Coolant Pump Trip in the event of a small break LOCA. FPL is a member of the Westinghouse Owner's Group and concurs with the June 15, 1981 Owners' Group letter (OG-60) from R. W. Jurgensen to P. S. Check. Our action to submit a proposed automatic RCP trip design awaits NRC approval of the Westinghouse Owners Group small break model. It is our understanding that such a submittal is not required until at least 3 months after such aforementioned NRC approval.
