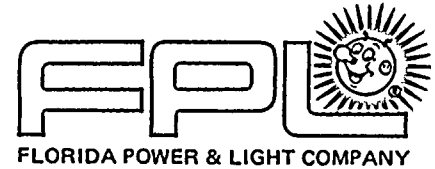

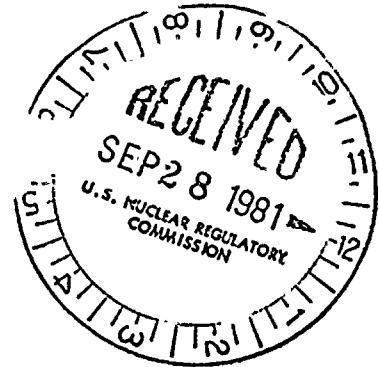

We have reviewed your letter dated August 21, 1981 regarding Pressurized Thermal Shock to Reactor Pressure Vessel, and have established the following schedule of responses:

Information Requested Within 60 Days

- a) Requests (1) (2) and (5) will be responded to within 60 days.
- b) Request (3) will be delayed until March 1, 1982. As provided in the May 14, 1981 letter, all Westinghouse plants, including Turkey Point Unit 4, meet the Vessel Integrity Criteria to beyond January 1983, at a minimum. The RT_{NDT} limit for Turkey Point Unit 4 (or equivalently, the specific date vessel integrity criteria may not be satisfied without taking remedial actions) will be developed as part of the current Westinghouse Owner's Group (WOG) program, as detailed in the May 14, 1981 letter. To attempt to provide this information at an earlier date than already committed to will impact the current WOG program in its ability to provide the information for all operating plants. In addition the RT_{NDT} limit requested is based on, in part, generic WOG analysis which is planned to be completed in January 1982.

Based on this consideration we do not anticipate being able to provide the requested RT_{NDT} limit earlier than March 1, 1982.

- c) Request (4), the basis of the RT_{NDT} limit has already been provided in the May 14, 1981 letter (i.e., basis of calculation of time in life that vessel integrity criteria may not be met without remedial actions). However, additional information will be provided currently with the RT_{NDT} limit requested in Request (3).

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- d) Request (5) will be responded to within 60 days based on available analyses. The WOG is continuing its effort to better define the most limiting event, and we may amend our response at a later date based on the results of their work.

Information Requested Within 150 Days

- a) Requests (1), (2), (3) and (4) will have responses based on WOG output. The schedule for the completion of this effort is currently January 1, 1982. Following receipt of the WOG report, we will evaluate the results and plan our future action accordingly. Information regarding remedial actions and any additional analysis deemed necessary will be included in this evaluation.

We will inform you of the results of this evaluation, and a schedule of all actions to be taken by March 1, 1982.

- b) We have begun developing the responses necessary to satisfy the Request for Additional Information. We plan on meeting the schedule you requested and will keep you informed of our progress.
