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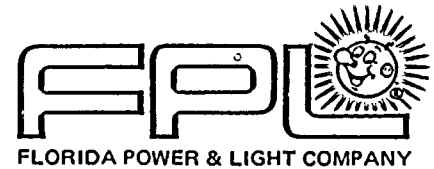
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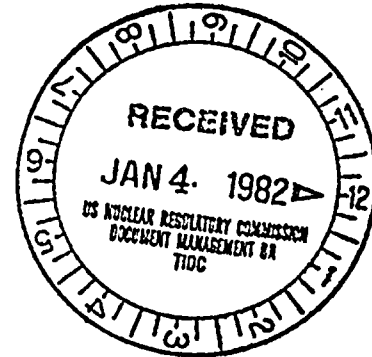

Re: St. Lucie Units 1 & 2, Turkey Point Units 3 & 4  
Docket Nos. 50-335, 50-389, 50-250, 50-251  
Exemption Request from Certain Requirements  
of 10 CFR 73.21 Sections (d) (2) and (e)



Pursuant to 10 CFR 73.5, Florida Power & Light Company respectfully requests the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to exempt St. Lucie Units 1 & 2 and Turkey Point Units 3 & 4 from certain requirements set forth in 10 CFR 73.21 Sections (d) (2) and (e) which respectively requires the following by January 20, 1982:

Section (d) (2) - Storage of safeguards information in a manner prescribed in Section (mm) of 10 CFR 73.21.

Section (e) - Marking of all safeguards classified material as delineated in Section (b) of 10 CFR 73.21.

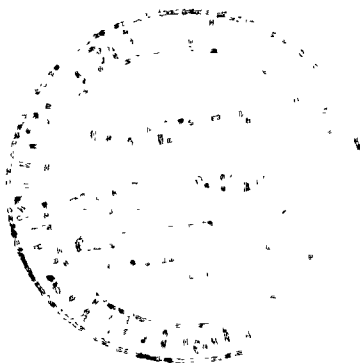
Specifically Florida Power & Light Company requests that we be granted an extension of 120 days for the requirement to be in full compliance with 10 CFR 73.21 Sections (d) (2) and (e) by January 20, 1982.

Among other preventative measures our present document control procedures require safeguards information to be locked up when not in use, stamped, and made available to a limited distribution on a need to know basis. It is our opinion that these measures combined with the degree of control Florida Power & Light Company maintains over the access to the areas within which this type of information is generally contained provides substantial protection of this material.

Florida Power & Light Company is in the process of procuring the GSA approved locks and associated mechanisms necessary to meet the storage requirements. However since our procurement needs appear to exceed the shelf availability of local suppliers, the additional time will be required to ensure full compliance. It should be stressed that those locks that are obtainable from local sources are being installed as soon as possible upon their receipt.

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

Additionally, procedures are being developed and are expected to be completed shortly that will instruct those holders of safeguards information on the proper handling, marking, and storage of such documents. However to be in full compliance with the new rule, additional time will be needed to complete and promulgate these new procedures and subsequently re-mark each individual document as prescribed.

For these reasons it is our opinion that an extension of 120 days from the requirements to meet Sections (d) (2) and (e) of 10 CFR 73.21 by January 20, 1982 is justified and that it's approval will not adversely impact the health and safety of the public, or compromise the common defense and security.
