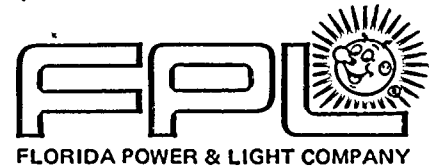

Appendix R Fire Protection Submittal Dates

This letter is in follow-up to our meeting in your office on May 18, 1982 to discuss the recently mandated July 1, 1982 Appendix R fire protection submittal dates.

As we discussed, Florida Power & Light is making every effort to provide the St. Lucie Unit 1 Appendix R fire protection submittal before July 1, 1982 in order to provide NRC staff additional review lead time prior to the inrush of industry submittals on July 1st. Since some of the St. Lucie Unit 1 report sections and appendices are similar to those that will be provided in the Turkey Point Unit 3 & 4 submittal, we hope that early submittal of St. Lucie Unit 1 will also help the Turkey Point Unit 3 & 4 staff reviewers.

As we further indicated in our meeting, we are very concerned about the effect of the rescheduling on the Turkey Point Unit 3 & 4 submittal which compressed the original FPL projected completion date of November 9, 1982 back to July 1, 1982. To accomplish this, FPL has shifted many key personnel from other assignments to this job and we will make every possible effort to make this revised/optimum schedule date. Unfortunately, this schedule is so compressed that untimely completion of any of the numerous milestones (by outside contractors or internal to FPL) will compound delay of the final submittal date. We will continue to keep the project managers apprised of the schedule status on a weekly basis.

We want to thank you for the opportunity of discussing these matters with you and hope that these schedules and all other fire protection issues will soon be agreed upon and resolved.
