Upon request of the Turkey Point NRC Project Manager, Mr. D. G. McDonald, FPL verbally agreed to support inspections in mid-October and November relating to maintenance and surveillance activities and certain operational (train vs. unit) events.

Subsequent to FPL agreeing to these inspections, the Turkey Point Plant was selected for an in-depth integrated design inspection of its auxiliary feedwater system as a consequence of the Davis-Besse event, and for an IAEA safeguards inspection on Turkey Point Unit 4.

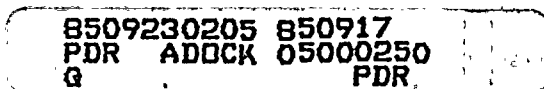
FPL is concerned that the impact these major programmatic inspections may have on key plant personnel (i.e. workload required in preparation for the inspections, inspector support, and in resolution of items identified during inspections) may be detrimental considering the short time interval in which they have been requested. Because of these additional inspections, FPL requests that the one-week maintenance and surveillance inspection be deferred until after the Unit 4 refueling outage, scheduled to begin January 1986.
