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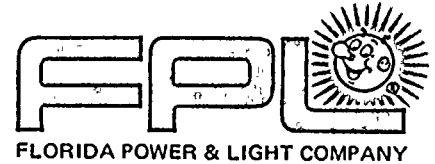

Emergency Operating Procedures Upgrade

By letter L-83-237 dated April 15, 1983, FPL committed to implement upgraded emergency operating procedures by December 31, 1985. That date was confirmed by an NRC order dated February 23, 1984 confirming FPL commitments an emergency response capability.

FPL has completed revision of the Turkey Point Plant emergency operating procedures in accordance with the Westinghouse Owners Group Emergency Response Guidelines and has used those procedures in operator requalification training at the Westinghouse Simulator. In light of recent IE inspections, particularly the Auxiliary Feedwater System Inspection, we have requested that FPL engineering review the upgraded emergency operating procedures prior to implementing them. That review will not be complete prior to December 31, 1985 commitment date.

Therefore, we request a 90-day extension of that date to March 31, 1986 in order to have sufficient time to complete the engineering review, resolve any comments resulting from that review, perform required Plant Nuclear Safety Committee reviews, and to issue the revised procedures.

We are working to implement the upgraded emergency procedures as soon as possible.
