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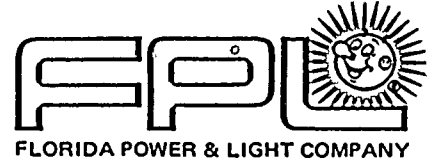

Your letter dated January 13, 1983 issued Amendment Nos. 91 and 85 to Facility Operating License Nos. DPR-31 and DPR-41 for Turkey Point Units 3 and 4. Included as part of that Amendment was a license condition that we satisfy any applicable requirement of P.L. 97-425 within 30 days (date corrected to within 90 days by D. McDonald's letter dated January 31, 1983). The applicable section of the Nuclear Waste Policy Act of 1982, Section 302(b) states that the NRC shall not issue or renew a license for a nuclear power plant unless the utility has signed a contract with the Department of Energy for disposal services, or the Secretary of Energy affirms in writing that a utility is actively and in good faith negotiating with the Department of Energy for a contract.

Please find attached a letter from Donald Paul Hodel, Secretary of Energy, certifying that Florida Power & Light Company is actively and in good faith negotiating with the Department of Energy for a nuclear waste disposal contract. This satisfies and fulfills the aforementioned license condition.
