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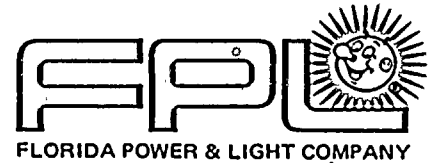

We have completed our review of your letter dated February 22, 1983 concerning the blocking of certain safety injection signals during plant cooldown at Turkey Point Units 3 & 4.

Although our current Technical Specifications allow bypassing the safety injection signals mentioned in your letter, we will submit a Technical Specification change to add footnotes to Table 3.5-2 Items 1.3 and 1.5 (High Differential Pressure and High Steam Flow) to provide clarification of the operating bypass conditions.

You also asked if there are any conditions under which Steam Line Isolation (Item 2.1 in Table 3.5-3) would be blocked. There are no operating bypasses on this signal.
