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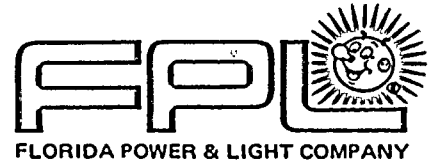

The purpose of this letter is to modify the schedules provided to you in our letter L-83-237, dated April 15, 1983, for the Safety Parameter Display System and Upgraded Emergency Operating Procedures.

Safety Parameter Display System (SPDS)

Hardware and software related problems, encountered at the manufacturer, has delayed shipment of the SPDS computers and their associated peripheral equipment approximately one-half year to July 1984. That delay effects Turkey Points Unit 4 SPDS schedule. Our new schedule for SPDS implementation is by the end of the Unit 4, 1985 refueling outage (scheduled to end about 12/85).

Upgrade of Emergency Operating Procedures

Our letter mentioned above, committed to provide a Procedures Generation Package (PGP) by March 1, 1984 and implement upgraded Emergency Operating Procedures (EOP's) by December 31, 1984. These dates were predicted on receipt of a completed package of information from the Westinghouse Owner's Group (WOG) by June, 1983.

To date, the WOG material has not been received. The Revision 1 procedures have arrived but not the basis documents; nor has the writers guide been received. The WOG has stated that the Revision 1 materials will be transmitted by February 29, 1984. Therefore, FPL has revised the ERG Implementation schedule based on the reception of WOG Rev. 1

materials in March, 1984. The PGP will be developed from WOG generic guides and submitted within six months of its arrival. The expected submittal date is October 1, 1984. Revision 1 Emergency Operating Procedures will be implemented by December 31, 1985.
