Re: Notification of the NRC of Employees' Potential Safety Issues

This responds to Mr. Victor Stello's April 27, 1989 letter to Mr. J. J. Hudiburg concerning the above-referenced matter. It is corporate policy that all safety concerns of Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) employees and employees of contractors be disclosed and receive proper attention. To this end, FPL has promulgated a policy statement and associated notice which are prominently posted instructing all workers of their responsibilities to report safety problems. Copies of the policy statement and associated notice have already been forwarded to the NRC (FPL letter L-89-95, dated March 8, 1989).

A search of past and present labor contracts has been conducted and, to the best of our knowledge, there are and have been no agreements between FPL and its employees containing restrictive clauses of the type referred to in Mr. Stello's April 27, 1989 letter. In addition, a procedure is currently in place which requires a review of contracts by the FPL Law Department or its designee (i.e., outside law firm). We expect that this will help ensure that no such restrictive clauses are present.

In addition, FPL has contacted major contractors to determine if such restrictive clauses existed or exist now in their contracts. FPL has been assured that no such clauses existed previously, nor do they now.
