## MANAGEMENT ACTIONS

### ST. LUCIE PLANT

1. On June 5, 1992, notification was received from Roche Biomedical Laboratory, the contracted DHHS approved laboratory, confirming an unsatisfactory performance testing incident. The incident involved the reporting of a false negative test result for a submitted Blind Sample due to a clerical error. Roche Biomedical Laboratories is in the process of combining their lab in Research Triangle Park with the Compuchem Laboratory facility. The screening programs which will be used at the Compuchem Laboratory provide for electronic transcription of results from the screening data to the computer database. The new program should minimize future transcription errors.
2. Fitness for Duty Reportable Events for St. Lucie Plant
  - 2.1 On March 2, 1992, a confirmed positive random test result was received on a licensee Production Area Supervisor for marijuana at 65 NG/ML. Telephone notification to the NRC was made at 1420 hours March 2, 1992. A review was conducted, with negative results of the subjects' work activities from December 30, 1992 through March 2, 1992 encompassing all work activities performed during this period.
  - 2.2 On June 16, 1992, a confirmed positive random test result was received on a contractor security supervisor for marijuana at 45 NG/ML. Telephone notification to the NRC was made at 0958 hours June 17, 1992. A review was conducted, with negative results of the Subjects' work activities from March 7, 1992 through June 16, 1992 encompassing all work activities performed during this period.
