The purpose of this letter is to inform you of our intention to change a previous commitment regarding the establishment of a Turkey Point Safety Engineering Group (SEG).

On April 11, 1984, FPL transmitted a letter from J. W. Williams, Jr. (FPL) to J. P. O'Reilly (USNRC). The purpose of that letter was to outline numerous performance enhancement initiatives at FPL that were being put in place to address Turkey Point's marginal regulatory performance. Included in those initiatives was a commitment to set up a small Safety Engineering Group which would provide additional oversight on plant operating issues and root cause evaluations.

Since that time, FPL has embodied strong independent review of plant operating conditions and enhanced root cause analysis techniques within other Turkey Point nuclear organizations. To eliminate this duplication of effort, it is our intent to dissolve the SEG group by the end of this year.

The Vice President of Nuclear Assurance will be responsible for closely and independently monitoring site activities regarding this commitment change to ensure that there is continued high quality in Turkey Point's regulatory performance.
