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I concur with the comments of Commissioner Remick, particularly his praise of the staff's fine work throughout the Regulatory Impact Survey process.

I agree with Commissioner Remick's request for an update one year from now on staff's progress on implementing these activities. Further, the update should not merely report on progress, but should be a vehicle for periodic assessment of the program described in this Secy. The assessment should evaluate lessons learned from the success or failure of different efforts, and from licensee assessments of these efforts. This assessment may suggest additional efforts, or modifications of efforts, which should be reported to the Commission. Staff activity should include periodic licensee surveys to get necessary information on ongoing efforts, and to maintain a better awareness of our impacts on licensees than we have had in the past. We should not wait until the situation has deteriorated again before repeating our efforts to learn of licensee concerns. A continuing program to obtain feedback from licensees can be accomplished without a large effort and expenditure of resources. Tailored, small scope surveys, can be most effective, if done on a programmed routine basis. The first staff progress report should outline how the staff plans to maintain such continuing feedback. That plan and subsequent plans should summarize the information obtained.
